#### WHY IT MATTERS



#### ABUSE IN SPORT: SAFESPORT DISCIPLINARY DATABASE

#### **CENTRALIZED DISCIPLINARY DATABASE (CDD):**

(as of 12/31/2023)

#### 2,040 INDIVIDUALS LISTED

The CDD is a resource designed to keep the public informed when adults connected with the Movement are either subject to certain temporary restrictions pending investigation by the Center or certain sanctions after an investigation found them in violation of the SafeSport Code. The database also contains certain eligibility decisions made by NGBs, their LAOs, or the USOPC, including those rendered prior to the establishment of the Center. Minors do not appear on the CDD.

#### **CDD ACTION TYPE BREAKDOWN**



Please note: The CDD includes two more action types: limited participation and probation but both represent less than 1% of the types of action the Center takes. CDD numbers change frequently as Respondents with temporary suspensions and restrictions come off the CDD and others are added.



#### **CHILD ABUSE STATISTICS**

- About 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 20 boys in the United States experience child sexual abuse.
- Someone known and trusted by the child or child's family members, perpetrates 91% of child sexual abuse.



#### WHAT MIGHT BE MISSING?

A coach who is also a parent of a youth demonstrates red-flag behavior (grooming, boundary violations) with a youth participant (athlete).

Parents/caregivers are afraid to report.



#### <u>Identification of Red Flag Sexual</u> <u>Grooming Behaviors</u>

#### Red Flag Child Sexual Grooming Behaviors: Level of Concern Guide



#### Interpretation Key

Enhanced Risk represents behaviors that are 1.68-3.46 times more likely in cases of child sexual abuse. Moderate Risk represents behaviors that are 3.47-6.70 times more likely in cases of child sexual abuse. High Risk represents behaviors that are at least 6.71 times more likely in cases of child sexual abuse.

#### WHAT MIGHT BE MISSING?

Youth 1 stands in the doorway of bathroom stall so Youth 2 cannot leave. Youth 1 demands Youth 2 touch their genitals.

Youth 2 touches the genitals of Youth 1 and later discloses to a family member what happened.
